#### **Behind the Name**

Greg's dad, Mike Ferency, was in the 1st Battalion, 7th Artillery during Vietnam. The unit's motto was Nunquam Fractum, which translates to "Never Broken." The idea is that if Vietnam couldn't break Mike, and Greg, even after being mortally wounded, managed to return nine shots, then we too will remain 'never broken' by this evil act.

The three "stitches" between Nunquam and Fractum represent hope, help, and healing as stated in the mission. With that mission in mind, our ultimate goal is for our law enforcement officers and first responders to be never broken.

The "129" on the flag is Greg's badge number. The blue line represents the "thin blue line." Finally, the worn texture of the logo represents Greg's 30 years of service.

# February 2025 | CIT Training



I had it in my heart to honor our local fallen hero by carrying a flag during an endurance event. I chose to participate in 3 races in a two-day period. The flag was carried for 31.45 miles. I felt that was a good number of miles for this occasion. During the races I had the opportunity to share Greg's story with hundreds of other race participants. There were countless people that asked to share and carry the flag, if just for a little bit in his honor. I was happy to share this moment with other LEO's, first responders, and LEO family members. After the last race I was joined by my friends that are veterans. We quietly folded the flag, shared some tears and agreed mission



accomplished. Greg would have been proud . I feel driven to honor our fallen in this unconventional way, it's my way of giving back to the families. I give this flag as a token of gratitude for the service that Greg gave for his community. I will forever be grateful for his service and grieve for his loss. Thank you for allowing me to openly celebrate the life of Greg with thousands of people for 2 days out there on those mountains.
